There is no logical reason presented for this by gov.</li> </ul> |

#### Wholesale & retail

| <ul> <li>Food, hygienic, cleaning, protective and baby care, stationery.</li> <li>Winter clothing, bedding, heating.</li> <li>Medical supplies.</li> <li>Fuel, coal, wood, gas and tobacco.</li> <li>Hardware supplies for qualified tradespersons: emergency repairs for homes and essential services.</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>All shops allowed to open subject to mandatory health protocols, masks for all customers.</li> <li>Staff to wear masks and gloves, regular sanitising of surfaces. Only one customer per 4m².</li> <li>e-commerce able to sell all goods to consumers online.</li> <li>Logistic chains for customer deliveries to run following similar health protocols.</li> <li>All clothing stores, hardware, stationery, ITC, and essential good stores to be open under conditions.</li> <li>Beauticians and hairdressers to be open subject to health protocols.</li> </ul> |

#### **Manufacturing**

| <ul> <li>100%: L4 products and inputs, and paper.</li> <li>50% stationery, cement and construction material.</li> <li>50% automotive manufacturing incl. components.</li> <li>100% petroleum smelters, refineries, furnaces.</li> <li>50% winter clothing, bedding and heating.</li> <li>100% inputs to essential services.</li> <li>Essential maintenance to prevent damage and to permit orderly shutdown.</li> <li>20% all other manufacturing.</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>All manufacturing allowed subject to:</li> <li>Compulsory masks, PPE and hand sanitiser.</li> <li>Screening regime and workplace testing stations.</li> <li>Increased worker spacing where some work remotely.</li> <li>New shifts and arrangements to minimise overlap, allow more space.</li> <li>Restrictions on headcount at work-related gatherings.</li> <li>Social distancing during all factory operations.</li> <li>Employees with symptoms to self-isolate/take sick leave.</li> <li>Change meeting routines for social distancing.</li> <li>Education material and other support resources available.</li> </ul> |
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## **Transport & logistics**

| <ul> <li>Cargo for domestic and neighbouring countries, and prioritisation of essential goods.</li> <li>e-hailing*.</li> <li>Limited public transport*.</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>All goods allowed to be imported and exported subject to sanitising on departure and arrival.</li> <li>Mask wearing on all public transport as well as sanitising on entry and exit.</li> <li>Transport of all goods allowed for export.</li> </ul> |

## Services: repair & emergency

| <ul> <li>Vehicle recovery services.</li> <li>Emergency car repairs.</li> <li>Emergency repair work incl. plumbers, electricians, locksmiths, glaziers, roof repair work.</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>Vehicle recovery.</li> <li>Car services allowed.</li> <li>Plumbers, electrical and trade work permitted under health protocols.</li> </ul> |

#### Restrictions

| National Government  | DA   |
|--|--|
| <ul> <li>No local or inter-provincial travel, except those operations returning to do or support L4; no international travel.</li> <li>No concerts, cinemas and gatherings.</li> <li>Limited exercise, no public gym*.</li> <li>No alcohol.</li> <li>No passenger air and sea travel.</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>No travel between provinces.</li> <li>No domestic air travel (open in level 3).</li> <li>No public gatherings.</li> <li>Outdoor exercise and dog walking allowed.</li> <li>Alcohol sales allowed Mon-Fri until 3pm. Limit on stock allowed to be bought.</li> </ul> |

## **Agriculture, forestry & fishing**

| <ul> <li>Food agriculture and services (livestock), export agriculture.</li> <li>Essential fishing operations.</li> <li>Essential harvesting and storage activities.</li> <li>Floriculture and forestry.</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>All agriculture allowed subject to health protocols.</li> <li>Commercial and subsistence fishing allowed, distancing to be observed.</li> </ul> |

## Mining & quarrying

| National Government   | DA  |

| <ul><li>100% coal production for Eskom.</li><li>100% open-cast mining.</li><li>50% other.</li></ul> | Mining activity to resume with the use of respirators,<br>sanitised transport, and deep cleaning of residential<br>units. |

#### Construction

|---|--|
| Critical civil engineering and construction for public<br>works projects (incl. water, energy, sanitation, roads<br>and bridges), critical maintenance repairs. | <ul> <li>Construction sites allowed to be open (similar to open-cast mining due to the open nature of the site).</li> <li>Health protocols to include masks, visors/googles, gloves.</li> <li>Sanitise surfaces before and after work.</li> <li>Meetings to be done in the open under distancing.</li> <li>COVID-19 officer to be appointed for each site to enforce protocols.</li> </ul> |

### **Health & welfare**

| National Government  | DA  |

| <ul> <li>Trade union essential staff*.</li> <li>All social work, care and relief.</li> <li>Funeral and cremation services.</li> <li>Wildlife management.</li> <li>Veterinary and medical services.</li> <li>Sanitation, pest control, sewerage and refuse removal, 50% recycling (paper/glass/metal), incl. informal traders.</li> </ul> | R1000 top-up for all grant receivers as opposed to caregivers only. |
