**2900. Mrs M O Clarke (DA) to ask the Minister of Police:**

- (1) What total number of (a) sectors are within the area of the Germiston Police Station and (b) vehicles are in each sector;
- (2) whether all the SA Police Service officers at the Germiston Police Station have completed their firearms competency tests in terms of shooting; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details;
- (3) what total number of officers were found not competent at the station?

**REPLY:**

- (1)(a) There are five sectors in the Germiston Police Station policing precinct.
- (1)(b) There is one vehicle, per sector.
- (2) No, not all the South African Police Service (SAPS) members, at the Germiston Police Station, have completed their firearm competency training. A total of 237 SAPS members, have completed the prescribed training, in terms of the legal principles and the use of firearms (handgun, shotgun and rifle). A total of nine members have not yet completed the prescribed training, due to the following:
- o Medical conditions – five members.
  - o Lateral appointment and medical condition (not yet attended the SAPS basic training) – one member.
  - o Disability (wheelchair bound) – one member.
  - o Newly appointed, after an arbitration award and not yet attended the SAPS basic training – one member.
  - o Declared unfit, in terms of Section 13 of the Firearms Control Act – one member.




- (3) None of the SAPS members, who attended the prescribed training, were found to be not competent.
