
- This application is dealt with as one of urgency, and the applicant's failure to comply with the rules in relation to the periods for service and the filing of papers, is condoned.

- inciting, implying or threatening the looting of, or damage to, any 3.4. business, home, building, public or private property, or infrastructure and/or looting or damaging these properties.
- shutting down or damaging schools, and inciting others to shut down 3.5. schools.
- shutting down or damaging businesses or government property and 3.6. infrastructure.
- preventing persons from attending their place of employment on 20 3.7. March 2023 or taking public transport.
