I, the undersigned,

LEON AMOS SCHREIBER

state as follows under oath:

- I am a Member of the National Assembly for the Democratic Alliance, a member of the National Assembly's Portfolio Committee on Public Service and Administration, and the applicant in this urgent contempt application.
- The facts in this affidavit are true and correct and are within my personal knowledge except where the context indicates otherwise. Legal submissions are made on the advice of my legal representatives.

INTRODUCTION

- On 2 February 2023, Wepener J gave an order against the first respondent ("the ANC"). As I explain below, the ANC's purported compliance with the order is inadequate and constitutes a breach of the order.
- The purpose of this application is to obtain relief declaring that the ANC is in breach of an order of this Court, and to compel the ANC to do what is necessary to comply. I also seek an order holding the ANC in contempt for its wilful and mala fide non-compliance with the order.
- 5 I attach a copy of the judgment and Court Order which I mark as Annexure "LAS1".



- 6 I address the following in the remainder of this affidavit:
 - 6.1 I provide a brief background to the Court Order.
 - 6.2 I set out the ways in which the ANC has failed to comply with the Court Order.
 - 6.3 I explain why I submit that I am entitled to the remedies that I seek.
 - 6.4 Urgency.

PARTIES

- 7 The first respondent is the ANC, a registered political party with its head office at Chief Albert Luthuli House, 54 Pixley ka Isaka Seme Street, Johannesburg.
- The second respondent is Mr Fikile April Mbalula an adult male Secretary General of the ANC. His primary place of business is at Chief Albert Luthuli House, 54 Pixley ka Isaka Seme Street, Johannesburg. His further details are unknown.
- The third respondent is Mr Thapelo Masilela, an adult male strategic support manager in the office of the Deputy Secretary General of the ANC. His primary place of business is at Chief Albert Luthuli House, 54 Pixley ka Isaka Seme Street, Johannesburg. His further details are unknown.
- The second and third respondents are the office-bearers through whom the ANC has purported to comply with the Court Order. As a result, I seek relief compelling them, together with the ANC to give proper effect to the Court Order.



BACKGROUND

My PAIA application

- 11 More than three years ago on 11 February 2021, I made a request to the ANC for access to information in terms of section 53(1) of the Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000 ("PAIA").
- 12 The ANC claimed it did not receive my request. I therefore delivered a second PAIA request on 22 February 2021. I attach a copy of that request which I mark as Annexure "LAS2".
- 13 My request sought access to the following information:
 - 13.1 Information on the processes followed and decisions taken by the ANC's Cadre Deployment Committee ("the Committee") between 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 13.2 The full contents of the ANC's cadre deployment policy including any amendments or changes introduced during the period of 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 13.3 Complete minutes including attendance registers for each meeting of the Committee during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 13.4 A list of all decisions taken by the Committee during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.

Y 100

- 13.5 The contents of any email, WhatsApp or other social media exchanges where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated or taken during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
- 13.6 Copies of all documents, including CVs and vacancy notices considered by the Committee during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
- 13.7 All correspondence communicating the decisions of the Committee to government officials, members of Cabinet, members of selection panels, or any other appointing authorities in the State.
- 14 The ANC raised no grounds under PAIA to refuse my request but repeatedly refused to make a decision on it. I was eventually forced to approach the High Court in June 2021.

The High Court Order

- The ANC repeatedly delayed the expeditious determination of my application to the High Court. I set this out in brief to demonstrate how the ANC's conduct was and remains calculated to frustrate and delay my rights.
 - 15.1 The ANC failed to deliver its heads of argument.
 - 15.2 I was forced to bring an application to compel the ANC to deliver its heads of argument in order to set the application down.
 - 15.3 On 25 May 2022, I was granted an unopposed order compelling the ANC to deliver its heads of argument within five days. I attach a copy of this order as Annexure "LAS3".

- 15.4 The ANC failed to comply with this order.
- 15.5 My attorneys set the matter down for hearing for 5 October 2022.
- 15.6 Three days before the hearing, the ANC's attorneys filed a notice of withdrawal, on the basis of which the ANC obtained a postponement of my application.
- 16 My application was eventually heard before Wepener J on 30 January 2023 and the judgment was handed down on 2 February 2023. The Court Order provides as follows:
 - "1. The decision of the ANC to refuse Schreiber's request for access to information dated 22 February 2021 is declared unlawful and invalid and is set aside.
 - The ANC is directed to provide all the information and records sought in Schreiber's request for access to information dated
 February 2021 within 5 court days of service of this order.
 - 3. The ANC shall pay the costs of this application including the costs of two counsel."

The meritless appeals

- The ANC sought leave to appeal from the High Court. On 21 June, Wepener J denied the ANC leave to appeal on the basis that the appeal lacked reasonable prospects of success and there was no other compelling reason to refer the matter to an appeal court.
- On 21 June 2023, the ANC filed an application for special leave to appeal to the Supreme Court of Appeal.



- 19 The Supreme Court of Appeal similarly dismissed the ANC's petition on 4 September 2023. I attach a copy of the SCA's order as Annexure "LAS4".
- 20 On 29 September 2023, the ANC filed a further application for leave to appeal to the Constitutional Court. That application was filed out of time.
- On 12 February 2024, the Constitutional Court dismissed the ANC's application with costs. I attach a copy of the Constitutional Court's order as Annexure "LAS5".
- In the result, the ANC was obliged to comply with Wepener J's order within five days, by 19 February 2024.

THE ANC'S FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE COURT ORDER

- On 19 February 2024, the ANC's attorneys delivered a letter together with certain documents in purported compliance with the Court Order. I attach the letter which I mark as Annexure "LAS6".
- 24 I further attach the following affidavits which accompanied the disclosures:
 - 24.1 The affidavit of Mr Fikile April Mbalula, which I mark as Annexure "LAS7".
 - 24.2 The affidavit of Mr Lungi Mtshali, which I mark as Annexure "LAS8".
 - 24.3 The affidavit of Mr Masilela (the second respondent) which I mark as Annexure "LAS9".
 - 24.4 The affidavit of Ms Desmoreen Carolus, which I mark as Annexure "LAS10".



- I do not attach all of the documents disclosed by the ANC in order not to overburden the Court. I do, however, disclose certain portions thereof, which I refer to below in order to demonstrate the ANC's failure to comply with the Court Order.
- On 22 February 2024, my attorneys addressed a letter on my behalf to the ANC. It set out the ways in which the ANC had failed to comply with the Court order and demanded that the non-compliance be rectified within two days. I attach a copy of the letter, which I mark as Annexure "LAS11".
- 27 My attorneys noted the following incidents of the ANC's unlawful non-compliance with the Court Order, the relevant aspects of which I expand on below. Amongst others, the ANC unlawfully and impermissibly
 - 27.1 redacted the disclosed documents;
 - 27.2 destroyed portions of the record;
 - 27.3 failed to deliver any information for an entire five-year period to which the order related;
 - 27.4 failed to list the decisions taken during the relevant period;
 - 27.5 restricted the scope of communications which it was required to disclose;
 - 27.6 provided hopelessly illegible copies of documents;
 - 27.7 refused to disclose draft minutes of Committee meetings; and
 - 27.8 failed to take adequate steps to obtain the full record of information.



LAS

The ANC's attorneys responded almost a week later. I attach their letter as Annexure "LAS12". In brief, the ANC denies its non-compliance. It refuses to engage on any of the issues raised and effectively says that my only option was to return to court for relief.

Unlawful redaction of documents

- The ANC has infringed the Court order by unilaterally redacting and thereby withholding select portions of the documents that have been disclosed. I attach a brief selection of the documents disclosed to demonstrate the nature of the redactions, which I mark as Annexure "LAS13".
- As is evident from the redactions, the ANC has, amongst others, removed all relevant names from the documents. This includes the names of Committee members, decision makers, ANC officials, government officials, and candidates considered and appointed by the Committee.
- In its letter and Mr Mbalula's affidavit, the ANC claims to have made these redactions in order to comply with the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 ("POPIA").
- The ANC's conduct in unilaterally effecting these redactions before disclosing the documents is unlawful and constitutes a breach of the Court order.
- POPIA does not require or authorise the ANC to make these redactions.
- 34 I am advised that section 26 of POPIA read with section 27(1)(b) has the effect of generally prohibiting the processing of personal information but this prohibition



does not apply if the processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of a right or obligation in law (section 27(1)(b)).

- This reflects the general authorisation in section 11(1)(c) of POPIA which allows personal information to be processed if it complies with an obligation imposed by law on the responsible party.
- The ANC plainly has a duty in law to comply with the Court Order. As a result, POPIA does not prevent it from processing personal information in order to do so.
- In any event, even if POPIA did preclude certain disclosures (which it does not), the provisions of PAIA, and thus the Court Order, take precedence. Section 5 of PAIA provides that it applies "to the exclusion of other legislation that... (a) prohibits or restricts the disclosure of a record of a public or private body; and (b) is materially inconsistent with an object, or a specific provision, of this Act".
- Disclosure of the complete unredacted records is required in order to comply with the Court Order, which does not contemplate any redactions or exclusions.
- The High Court's reasoning demonstrates, moreover, how the redaction of names would obstruct the very exercise of rights that its Order was intended to facilitate. Amongst others, the Court considered at paragraph 17 of its judgment that I intended, as a member of Parliament, to use the information to exercise my right and duty of oversight over appointments of individuals to organs of State and their performance. As the Court held: "That right and duty necessitates the disclosure of facts in relation to the appointment of individuals." To remove the



identity of those individuals who were appointed and of those who participated in the process fundamentally undermines the purpose of the Court order.

- As I explained in my affidavit in the application before Wepener J, the purpose of accessing the Committee's records would be to understand, amongst others, which positions have been targeted in the past for deployment, whether there was any unlawfulness in the process, who the beneficiaries were, and what the motivations and incentives were in making particular appointments. This, I explained, would provide information that is crucial to me exercising my role as a member of Parliament and of the Portfolio Committee on Public Service and Administration to reviewing key appointments and transactions in the public sector that may require further investigation and political oversight.
- If the identities are concealed of the beneficiaries of deployment, of those who decided to deploy them in the Committee, and those in government who executed the Committee's decisions, the disclosed information is largely useless to me in exercising my rights and duties as a parliamentarian. Without the names of persons implicated, I cannot determine who benefited from deployment, and what the Committee's and government officials' motivations and incentives were. Without the names of these parties, I cannot enquire into the legality of any particular appointment process because I simply do not know who was appointed, by whom, and under whose influence.
- If the identity of those appointed is concealed, it is not possible to determine the impact of the policy of cadre deployment on the organs of state that they were deployed to.



- As a result, any processing of personal information which is entailed by making that disclosure is permissible under POPIA because it constitutes compliance with a legal obligation which the ANC has.
- 44 Mr Mbalula's contention that POPIA required the ANC to carry out the redactions is unsustainable. The duty to disclose the full records in terms of a Court Order constitutes an obligation imposed by law as contemplated in sections 11 and 27 of POPIA and, accordingly, must be complied with and the processing is authorised in terms of those provisions.
- In any event, the only time at which it may have been permissible for the ANC to raise concerns about the disclosure of personal information was when the ANC dealt with my PAIA request.
- If there was any genuine confidentiality or privacy concern arising out of the disclosure of the documents sought, the ANC was required to refuse the request for access on this basis in terms of section 63(1) of PAIA. The general duty on the ANC in section 63(1) of PAIA to refuse to disclose personal information is repeated in section 23(4)(a) of POPIA.
- 47 The ANC did not do so.
- As a result, if the ANC wished to redact portions of the records it would have had to justify those redactions in the litigation in response to my PAIA request. Any such redaction would then have formed part of the debate before Wepener J, and if the ANC's concerns were held to be justified, would have formed part of his order. The ANC cannot now unilaterally redact the documents, having failed to raise this issue in the litigation.

My attorneys demanded in their letter that the ANC disclose the unredacted documents. The letter made clear the above deficits in the ANC's claim to protection under POPIA. That the ANC failed to disclose the unredacted documents thereafter, and offered no meaningful response to the legal issues raised in my attorneys' letter, demonstrates its wilfulness in disrespecting the Court Order.

Admission to destroying significant parts of the records

- Mr Masilela, an official of the ANC, is presented by Mr Mbalula in his affidavit as the primary custodian of the Committee's records: he is the only person whose communications were disclosed by the ANC.
- Mr Masilela states under oath in paragraph 6 of his affidavit, that during 2023 he destroyed a large volume of information that the ANC was required to disclose under the Court Order. He says:

"During 2023, my personal email which I used for the Deployment Committee was full. In an attempt to free up space, I sorted emails by size and deleted the majority of the big files. A number of emails which relate to the Deployment Committee were included".

- This conduct constitutes an offence in terms of section 90(1) of PAIA which provides that:
 - "(1) A person who with intent to deny a right of access in terms of this Act—
 - (a) destroys, damages or alters a record;
 - (b) conceals a record; or
 - (c) falsifies a record or makes a false record,



commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two years."

- It would appear from his affidavit that Mr Masilela, acting on the ANC's behalf, destroyed the emails <u>after</u> the Court Order had been granted, in the course of 2023.
- As the primary custodian of the Committee's records, Mr Masilela would have been aware of the High Court order. He would certainly have been consulted by the ANC's legal representatives in their opposition to my application and the subsequent applications for leave to appeal.
- His destruction of the information and its timing demonstrates that Mr Masilela's conduct was conducted wilfully and with the intent of denying my right of access in terms of PAIA. It accordingly constitutes a criminal offence under PAIA. It also demonstrates the extent to which the ANC has acted to subvert the Court Order.
- I intend to lay a criminal charge against Mr Masilela shortly. I shall provide the Court with a copy of the charge sheet and case number when it is available.
- In addition to his conduct being a crime under section 90(1) of PAIA,

 Mr Masilela's conduct is plainly contemptuous of the Court Order, both

 personally and as a representative of the ANC.

Withholding information for a five-year period

The ANC has defied the Court Order by failing to disclose any minutes, attendance registers, communications or decisions of the Committee's proceedings for a five-year period from 1 January 2013 to May 2018. This is the





very same period in which the ANC's and the country's current President, Cyril Ramaphosa, was the chairperson of the Committee.

- 59 Mr Mbalula claims in paragraph 10 of his affidavit that:
 - 59.1 "There are no minutes of meetings for this period as minutes were not kept".
 - 59.2 He says that Ms Carolus and Mr Mtshali confirm this in their affidavits and that it is confirmed by the report of the Judicial Commission of Inquiry into Allegations of State Capture, Corruption and Fraud in the Public Sector ("the Zondo Commission"). I attach the extracts from the portion of the Zondo Commission report that Mr Mbalula refers to as Annexure "LAS14".
 - 59.3 Mr Mbalula says further that decisions by the Committee during this period could not be retrieved because there are no minutes to confirm what decisions were taken.
- 60 The ANC's claims are not credible.
 - This is clear from the very first page of the minutes of 11 May 2018 that it disclosed and which I attached as "LAS9". The 11 May 2018 minutes state that "The minutes of the previous meeting held on 19/03/2018 were adopted." The disclosed minutes themselves therefore prove that minutes existed for the preceding period.
 - 60.2 The ANC has also at no stage, following my PAIA request or during the litigation, stated that the record or any portion thereof does not exist.

- 60.2.1 If the ANC intended to rely on the alleged non-existence of the requested information, it was obliged by section 55 of PAIA, after the request was received, to confirm on oath that the information did not exist and the steps it had taken to locate the information. It failed to do so.
- 60.2.2 To the contrary, the ANC's initial communications with me on my PAIA request expressed a willingness to disclose the requested information but for its technical objections. The author, Mr Krish Naidoo, inferred his knowledge of the record and that it existed. I attach Mr Naidoo's letter as Annexure "LAS15", where he states in the final paragraph that "The required information will be made available once the DA has satisfied the legal requirements".
- 60.2.3 The ANC vehemently opposed the Court Order but never suggested that a part of the record did not exist. It failed to raise this as a defence at any stage in the litigation.
- The PAIA request is in any event not limited to minutes of Committee meetings but extends to <u>all information</u> on the processes and decisions of the Committee during the period 2013 2021. Therefore, even if meeting minutes were not kept between 2013 2018 (which I deny) this does not preclude the ANC from disclosing other sources of information on the Committee's processes and decisions during this time. It is not credible for the ANC to claim that there exists no documentary or digital trace at all of any communications on the Committee's processes during this five-year period.

- The portion of the Zondo Commission report which Mr Mbalula annexed to his affidavit in fact confirms that there exists information relating to the Committee's processes during the 2013 2018 period. At paragraph 394, President Ramaphosa is reported as stating under oath, "I think those who are in charge will just take notes and just record a decision and it is then communicated". The Court Order required the ANC to disclose all of this information, including the "notes" taken, the decisions recorded, and the communication of those decisions as referred to by President Ramaphosa.
- 60.5 Having heard extensive evidence on the issue, the Zondo Commission Report held at paragraph 396 that it was "improbable that there are no records of the Committee's activities between 2012 and 2017" and referred, amongst others, to the ANC's history of always ensuring important meetings are minuted.
- Mr Mbalula states at paragraph 10(a) of his affidavit that the fact that minutes were not kept is confirmed by Ms Desmoreen Carolus and Mr Lungi Mtshali who he says "were often present during those meetings" during the period December 2012 to December 2017. However, the affidavits of Ms Carolus and Mr Mtshali do not confirm the allegation:
 - 60.6.1 To the contrary, Ms Carolus states that she had nothing to do with the Committee at paragraph 5 of her affidavit and that "it never came across my desk in any form". There is therefore no basis for her to swear to whether or not records of the Committee's meetings and decisions were made.

- 60.6.2 Mr Mtshali does not state the period in which he acted as the coordinator in the office of the Deputy Secretary General or on what basis he would have knowledge of whether or not the Committee kept minutes or any other recording of its meetings. He discloses no efforts to locate his laptop or extract the documents thereon nor of any efforts to locate or extract documents or communications relating to the Committee which would likely have been stored on his email account.
- This aspect of the ANC's non-compliance with the Court Order was raised in the letter to the ANC sent by my attorneys in order to afford it an opportunity to rectify its deliberate omissions. The ANC's curt response in its letter demonstrates its disregard for the Court Order.
- Further to this five-year gap, it is apparent from the minutes that were disclosed that the minutes of the following meetings were also omitted by the ANC, in further defiance of the Court Order:
 - 62.1 21 May 2018.
 - 62.2 6 August 2018.
 - 62.3 All meetings between the period of 22 March to 19 August 2019.
 - 62.4 12 November 2019.

Limiting the scope of communications disclosed

The ANC defied the Court Order by failing to disclose all of the communications of its members and staff relating to the Committee's practices.

- As stated in paragraph 10(e) of Mr Mbalula's affidavit, the ANC has unilaterally decided to limit the scope of the information it disclosed to those between Mr Masilela and the members of the Committee.
- The ANC was required to provide "any and all" such communications where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated or taken.

 This includes communications between Committee members.
- 63.3 In particular, it was obliged to disclose communications relating to the Committee's work by and involving President Cyril Ramaphosa, who was the chairperson of the Committee between 2013 and 2018.
- 63.4 Moreover, the ANC has only disclosed a select portion of largely illegible communications from Mr Masilela from 2020 and a few from 2019 and 2021. This excludes, amongst others, any and all emails, WhatsApps or other social media exchanges where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated or taken during 2013 2018.
- The ANC has failed to disclose any of the attachments included in the portions of select WhatsApps and Emails that were disclosed. I attach a brief selection of those communications to indicate the presence of attachments which the ANC has precluded from disclosure. I mark this as Annexure "LAS16".
- These omissions were also raised in the letter to the ANC sent by my attorneys.

 It failed to rectify this obvious non-compliance.



Providing illegible documents

- The ANC has failed to comply with the Court order insofar as it has provided certain documents which are entirely illegible. The obviously poor quality of these documents exemplifies the obstructiveness of the ANC's approach to fulfilling the Court order. Because these documents are drawn from digital communications, there ought to be no reason why a legible copy cannot be obtained.
- On receiving the ANC's disclosure, I instructed my attorneys to request from the ANC's attorney to be provided with legible copies of the WhatsApp communications. The document subsequently provided continued to include indecipherable information.
- 67 I attach an extract of the illegible information which I mark as Annexure "LAS17".
- The ANC failed to rectify this non-compliance on being notified of it in detail by my attorneys' letter.

Refusing to disclose draft minutes

- 69 Mr Mbalula states at paragraph 10(b) of his affidavit that minutes of meetings that were not officially adopted have not been disclosed. This is impermissible and in breach of the Court order.
- The Court order obliges the ANC to disclose all information on the processes and decisions of the Committee during the period 2013 2021. This would include documentary records of meetings in the form of notes and draft minutes, whether or not those minutes were ultimately adopted by the Committee.



- The fact that draft minutes which were prepared by a staff or Committee member were not ultimately adopted may impact the interpretation or reliability of the minutes as an accurate record of the proceedings, but it does not preclude them from disclosure.
- This too was raised by my attorneys in their letter to the ANC on which issue no response was received.

Taking inadequate steps to locate the record

- 73 The steps allegedly taken by the ANC to locate the requested information are inadequate and do not amount to reasonable compliance with the Court Order.
- Mr Mbalula states only that the files of the late Ms Duarte were searched and that staff members who provided secretarial services to the Committee were consulted. Mr Mbalula does not state:
 - 74.1 which staff members were consulted; or
 - 74.2 that any or all of the still living members of the Committee during 2013 2021 were consulted or their files examined.
- 75 Jarringly absent is any effort to obtain communications from President Ramaphosa. Despite being the Chairperson of the Committee for the entire five-year period for which the ANC claims it mysteriously lacks any documentation, President Ramaphosa fails to depose to an affidavit stating that he has no records in his email, WhatsApps or other records of the Committee's activities.
- Had the ANC genuinely tried to make a full disclosure as the Court order requires it to do, it would have timeously contacted and obtained information from each

and every member of the Committee during the period 2013 to 2021. It has had over three years since my request was made to do so. The superficiality of its efforts demonstrates its lack of respect for the Court Order.

THE ANC'S NON-COMPLIANCE IS CONTEMPTUOUS

- 77 I am advised that an applicant who alleges contempt of court must show that:
 - 77.1 a court order was granted against the contemnor;
 - 77.2 the contemnor was duly served with the order or has knowledge of it; and
 - 77.3 the contemnor failed to comply with the court order.
- The ANC is apparently aware of the Court Order and has acknowledged it under oath. I have also detailed several instances of the ANC's non-compliance with it.
- 79 I am advised that in this context, the ANC's wilfulness and *mala fides* are presumed unless it can provide sufficient evidence otherwise.
- It is nonetheless apparent that the ANC's non-compliance with the Court Order is both wilful and *mala fides*. I say so for the following reasons:
 - 80.1 First, the most startling demonstration of the ANC's wilfulness and bad faith is in Mr Masilela's admission under oath to intentionally destroying documents after the Court Order had been granted.
 - 80.2 Second, the ANC's excuses for failing to comply with the Court Order are themselves unlawful.
 - 80.2.1 The ANC's alleged confidentiality concerns (insofar as its unlawful redactions are concerned) are contrived. The ANC failed to raise



these issues over the past three years since I made my application and prosecuted it through the courts. Either it infringed section 63(1) of PAIA or it is an *ex post facto* fabrication in an effort to resist the court ordered disclosure.

- 80.2.2 Similarly, the ANC's claims regarding the absence of documents from 2013 to 2018 are made for the first time now. Either the ANC infringed section 55 of PAIA or these documents in fact exist and have been wilfully withheld.
- Third, the ANC's non-compliance and disrespect of judicial authority takes place in the context of its repeated delays, non-compliance with a previous court order, and meritless applications for leave to appeal. Dippenaar J, in describing the ANC's postponement in the preceding litigation said that "One is left with the distinct impression that it is a delaying tactic". The ANC's non-compliance with the Court Order is a deliberate continuation of those tactics in light of the looming elections.
- 80.4 Fourth, the ANC has been afforded an opportunity to correct its non-compliance with the Court Order by my attorneys' letter. Yet it persists in refusing to abide by the Court Order.
- 80.5 Fifth, the ANC has refused to abide by a reasonable tender in my attorneys' letter for a neutral third party to attempt to extract the information destroyed by Mr Masilela and other information on his hard drive or laptop and that of Mr Mthali that the ANC alleges to be inaccessible. If the ANC had any concern to respect the Court Order, and



was being truthful about the inaccessibility of certain excluded information, it would have accepted that tender.

- 80.6 Finally, I am advised that, considered cumulatively, the ANC's conduct and the multitude of ways in which it has attempted to undermine the Court Order leave no room for doubt that it is acting both wilfully and in bad faith in its non-compliance.
- But even if this Court finds for some reason that the respondents non-compliance was not *mala fide* (which is denied), I am advised that it is nonetheless appropriate and competent for this Court to grant declaratory and mandatory relief to give effect to the Court Order. I have sought such relief in paragraphs 3, 4 and 5 of the notice of motion.

THE APPLICATION IS URGENT

- I am advised that contempt proceedings are inherently urgent because contempt threatens the courts' authority and the rule of law, which harm is exacerbated the longer the defaulting party is allowed to remain in contempt. The harm to the public caused by ongoing, wilful default of a court order cannot be suitably addressed in the ordinary course.
- 83 There are, in addition, four further reasons that make the application urgent.
- First, as the ruling party in South Africa, the ANC's wilful defiance of a court order constitutes a particularly acute assault on the integrity of the judiciary. It signals to South Africans that, as far as the ruling party is concerned, court orders need not be obeyed.



Second, over a year has passed since the Court Order and over three years since I made my initial PAIA application. The ANC took all available steps to delay implementation of that order. If this application is heard in the ordinary course, I will likely have to wait months if not years for the relief to which the Constitutional Court has now held that I am entitled.

Third, Wepener J granted the Court Order because I required the information to protect my rights and to uphold my duties as a Member of Parliament in the public interest. The longer I am deprived of access to this information, the longer my rights are harmed and my legal duties obstructed.

Fourth, the ANC's stratagem of delaying disclosure of the information has an obvious explanation: the looming election and the ANC's desire to keep the electorate in the dark. If this matter is heard in the ordinary course, this insidious strategy will succeed.

I have explained above the ways in which the Court held the information to be necessary for me to fulfil my rights and duties as a Member of Parliament. These are functions that are public facing and which serve the public interest.

Cadre deployment has become a hotly debated and influential issue in the upcoming general election that is scheduled for 29 May 2024. Cadre deployment goes to the heart of how we expect the public service to be filled, funded and operated in a democratic State. It is also central to corruption and maladministration in the State.

90 If information about how cadre deployment is actually practiced – and in relation to whom – remains in the dark, citizens will be left to grapple with only the rhetoric

of political parties to guide their views on this critical issue. This is undemocratic

and undermines the very purpose of PAIA and the constitutional right of access

to information. Citizens should be able to make up their own minds on the issue.

They can only do so if all of the court ordered information is disclosed in full.

91 If the ANC is allowed to abuse the court process and undermine the Court Order

to delay disclosure further, citizens will be facing the general elections without

the information they require to exercise an informed decision at the polls.

92 I therefore submit that the order I seek in prayer 1 of the notice of motion should

be granted.

PRAYER

93 I pray that the Court grant me the relief I seek in my notice of motion.

94 Finally, I pray for punitive costs. Such an order is warranted by the ANC's

obstruction of my rights and disrespect of this Court's authority.

Summary: Access to records In terms of the Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000 – Right to gain access dependant on right which requester wishes to exercise or protect. Such right not limited to fundamental Constitutional right. Compliance with provisions of PAIA is a necessary precondition to lodge an application to Court.

JUDGMENT

Wepener, J:

- [1] The first applicant is Leon Schreiber ('Schreiber'), a member of the National Assembly who represents the second applicant, the Democratic Alliance ('DA'), in the National Assembly. The second applicant is the Democratic Alliance, a registered political party and body corporate with perpetual succession and capable of suing in its own name.
- [2] The respondent is the African National Congress ('ANC') a registered political party. It is common cause that the ANC is a 'private body' for purposes of the Promotion of Access to Information Act¹ ('PAIA').
- [3] The applicant seeks the following relief:
 - 1. That the decision of the ANC to refuse the applicant's request for access to information dated 22 February 2021 is declared unlawful and invalid and is set aside.
 - That the ANC is directed to provide all of the information and records sought in the applicants' request for access to information dated 22 February 2021 within 5 court days.'

There is also the usual requests for costs.

- [4] If regard is had to the affidavits filed in the matter there are a number of disputes that can be identified, save that I could discern no serious dispute of fact that may have a bearing on the issues to be determined.
- [5] During the course of last year the applicants filed a supplementary affidavit in which its sought leave from the court to file that affidavit. It was alleged that the information became available subsequent to the filing of all the affidavits and that the information obtained contradicted much of that which is contained in the answering affidavit. There was no address during argument regarding the affidavit nor was there any opposition to the court receiving the affidavit and no affidavit was sought to be filed in response thereto. In the circumstances the supplementary affidavit properly forms part of the papers before me. The ANC filed its answering affidavit late and sought condonation for the late filing. The application for condonation was not opposed and it, too, is admitted.
- [6] Prior to the hearing, and at my invitation, the parties held a pre-hearing meeting and filed a revised joint practice note which limited the issues for determination to six in number. However, after hearing argument for the applicants, counsel for the ANC, at the outset of his address, limited the issues further by abandoning reliance on some of the issues and or not pursuing others. What remained was:
 - [6.1] whether the DA had locus standi to bring the application and the affect of the DA's locus standi on the costs of the application;
 - [6.2] Whether the request for documents complies with s 50(1)(a) of PAIA² more particularly, whether the applicants demonstrated that the records which it requested were for the exercise or protection of any rights.
- [7] The first issue will not result in the matter being finalised without the second issue being determined. However, counsel for the ANC submitted that a precondition for the exercise of a right to access any records in terms of s 50(1)(a) is that the requester should have first requested the required record in terms of s 53 of PAIA.³ Only after such

application can a party, competently, rely on the provisions of s 584 of PAIA and allege that there was a refusal to furnish the record and approach a court due to such refusal. This submission was met by argument that as long as one party, in this case Schreiber, indeed has locus standi, the matter can and should be decided on the merits. For the proposition reliance was placed on Oakdene Square Properties.⁵ In my view, it may very well be so that Schreiber has a clear case to bring the application (and his right was not disputed save to the extent set out below), but that does not permit the DA to attempt to enforce provisions of PAIA without it having complied with the prerequisites contained in PAIA to enable it to launch an application of this nature. The DA failed to follow the prerequisite steps in order to rely on a right to approach a court for relief, and thus failed to lay a basis for its right to be an applicant in this matter as it never qualified as a 'requester' in terms of s 78(1) of PAIA.⁶ However, the right of Schreiber is not tainted and any relief, if granted, will be granted to Schreiber. Counsel for the ANC was unable to suggest what prejudice there may have been due to the DA being cited as a party. The submission that the law regarding the locus standi of the DA had to be researched is not convincing as the fact that the DA had not requested any records and thus had no right to utilise the provisions of PAIA, in my view, did not require any substantial research. Its irregular joinder consequently has no material bearing on the costs in this matter.

(ii) the requester;

- [8] Having regard to the papers before me, the issue, although resulting in a finding in favour of the ANC, pales into insignificance. Schreiber set out all the facts in his affidavit and the DA, save for its name in the heading and a letter attached to the papers, added nothing to the matter.
- [9] The only issue then is whether, by requesting the documents, Schreiber has shown that he requested it for the exercise of a particular right. In so far as there are disputes on the affidavits, these are resolved on the basis of the version of the ANC, but that the uncontested version of Schreiber is also to be taken into account. The records requested by Schreiber are those of the ANC in relation to the process and decisions of the ANC's National Cadre Deployment Committee between 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
- [10] These records are required because the policies and practices of cadre deployment by the ANC influence which individuals are appointed and employed by State institutions. In answer to this, the deponent on behalf of the ANC denies that the ANC has loyalty to it as a precondition for employment in the public sector. However, it is common cause that the ANC's Deployment Committee is indeed at least a recommending committee which recommends individuals for appointment by the authorised State decision makers. Counsel for the ANC submitted that there are instances where the wishes of the Deployment Committee are not taken into account. The corollary of this is that there are indeed instances where the appointments are so made.
- [11] The evidence before this court goes much further. In the supplementary affidavit, which was not objected to and which I permitted to be introduced contains evidence which was placed before the Commission into State Capture ('the Zondo Commission'). During his evidence, the president of the ANC (who was also president of the country) stated that it is inappropriate for activities of the Deployment Committee to be done in dark corners and he accepted that it should instead be done openly and transparently. The Deployment Committee documents, which were disclosed at the Zondo Commission, demonstrate that not only that the Deployment Committee, inter alia, gets involved in 'judicial appointments' it recommended names of persons as judges or candidates for the Bench.



[12] The National Chairperson of the ANC gave evidence before the Zondo Commission where he said, of the deployees so recommended by the Deployment Committee that:

'Comrades once deployed are expected to work on behalf of the [ANC] movement in the public service and parastatals'.

In my view, such a deployment may detract from the objectivity of the person so employed who had to 'work' on behalf of the ANC.

[13] There is also the evidence of the Ms. Hogan, who is a former Minister of Public Enterprises, who stated that it was a practice of the ANC's structures which showed a sense that certain ANC committees

'saw it as their right to instruct a Minister who should be appointed and not appointed', a practice which she considered to be 'an abuse of power and is usurping executive authority'. In her evidence she describes significant pressure that she faced to appoint particular candidates within State-owned enterprises. She further said:

'(T)here was no clarity . . . I would ask now who is the Deployment Committee and who is doing what?'

She said she was left 'very confused about what is happening'. Ms. Hogan described the effect of the ANC's Deployment Committee as having the result that 'a handful of people' simply decide, without any transparency, on the appointment of a 'huge number of people' in government. She further stated that the Deployment Committee ' if captured . . . it can have a fundamental impact on government' as a result of the Committee's undue influence on appointments. Ms. Hogan stated that the internal ANC dynamics

'encouraged and entrenched nepotism and patronage from within the ranks of the ANC and the Tri-Partite Alliance and this would have very damaging consequences for State owned enterprises and, by extension, for the economy.'

[14] This evidence was uncontradicted. I do not deal in any detail with all the allegations in the affidavits, which reference is made to and which was led before the Zondo Commission. Not much of this was referred to during argument before me.



The final question remains whether the documents were required within the [15] context of s 50(1)(a) of PAIA and that this should be determined with regard to the particular right which is or is not inextricably bound-up with the facts of the matter.7 What may be required of a party is based on the fact that the term 'required' is a flexible one.8

Schreiber said that the information required is necessary for him to protect certain [16] rights. He pointed to three purposes of rights. Firstly, that the DA (of which he is a member) in its capacity as official opposition in Parliament wishes to enact legislation to govern the practice of cadre deployment and to control its detrimental impacts on the public. In order to properly craft legislation one needs to know exactly what cadre deployment consists of and what its consequences may be. Schreiber attached a draft bill that would impact on the matter if passed by Parliament. The ANC's response was that the desire to draft a bill is not done in an exercise of any right or any fundamental right but is done as a duty of a political party that is represented in Parliament. The requirements of PAIA do not refer to any fundamental right as if such right has to appear in the Bill of Rights. It is not in dispute that Schreiber has the right to introduce a bill into Parliament, whether he may do so by virtue of his right or a duty placed on the official opposition or political party, in my view, makes no difference.

Secondly, it is common cause that as a member of Parliament, Schreiber has a duty of oversight over appointments to organs of state and the performance of organs of state. In my view, it is indeed so that the parliamentary oversight is best served with full knowledge of all the factors that go into the decisions to appoint individuals. Again, the ANC submitted that no fundamental right was involved. It is not contested that Schreiber, in the aforesaid capacity, has both the right and duty of oversight in parliamentary processes, which include the appointment of individuals to serve in organs of state. That right and duty necessitates the disclosure of facts in relation to the appointment of individuals.

Thirdly, Schreiber advances that a category of litigation is relevant. The category [18] includes applicants for positions who may have been denied opportunities or who may

wish in future to apply for opportunities in the public service who will be enabled to enforce their rights with a better understanding of how cadre deployment works. In this regard individuals using the information may be able to challenge unlawful or irregular appointments in court.

[19] I am not convinced that Schreiber's application based on these undisclosed 'thousands of applicants for positions . . .' has a proper basis. In *Unitas* it was said:9

The real issue is, therefore, whether in the circumstances of this case, s 50 afforded Mrs.

Van Wyk a right to what amounts to a pre-action discovery'

and further:10

'I do not believe that open and democratic societies would encourage what is commonly referred to as "fishing expeditions", which could well arise if s 50 is used to facilitate preaction discovery as a general practice . . . nor do I believe that such a society would require
a potential defendant, as a general rule, to disclose his or her whole case before any action
is launched. The deference shown by s 7 to the rules of discovery is, in my view, not
without reason. These rules have served us well for many years. They have their own
built-in measures of control to promote fairness and to avoid abuse. Documents are
discoverable only if they are relevant to the litigation, while relevance is determined by the
issues on the pleadings. The deference shown to discovery rules is a clear indication, I
think, that the Legislator had no intention to allow prospective litigants to avoid these
measures of control by compelling pre-action discovery under s 50 as a matter of course.'

[20] I am of the view that the aggrieved persons may well take steps should they wish to take legal steps and obtain documents through discovery. Such documents would be in the possession of the official of state who took the decision in relations to the appointment. In so far as these documents may not be in that person's possession, the Rules of Court¹¹ provide for assistance. I am consequently not convinced that Schreiber's catch-all application on behalf of unknown persons meets the requirement that the record is either required or necessary for him. Despite my conclusion on this latter aspect, it is relevant to note that the applicant has set out the three grounds (and others) in his affidavit

as being the reasons why the information is required for the exercise or protection of a right and will be of assistance in the exercise or protection of that right. 12 Schreiber has set out, and prima facie established, the right which is sufficient proof for an applicant to result in his entitlement to access to the record for the exercise and protection of the right.13

There is no meaningful denial that the records are required for the purposes [21] established by Schreiber. This strengthens the case that the documents are indeed required, at least on the basis of the first two purposes set out by Schreiber.

The parties did not address me regarding a time period for compliance with nor the [22] question of costs save for the ANC's submission that the DA caused additional research. In the circumstances, I accept that the time period for compliance to be five court days. Both parties were represented by two counsel and I accept that both parties regarded that step as being justified.

[23] In the circumstances, I issue the following order:

- The decision of the ANC to refuse Schreiber's request for a access to information 1. dated 22 February 2021 is declared unlawful and invalid and is set aside.
- The ANC is directed to provide all the information and records sought in Schreiber's 2. request for access to information dated 22 February 2021 within 5 court days of service of this order.
- The ANC shall pay the costs of this application including the costs of two counsel. 3.

The request is firstly aimed at protecting the Constitutional right to equality as contained in section 9 of the Bill of Rights, and read with section 197 (3), which stipulates that "No employee of the public service may be favoured or prejudiced only because that person supports a particular political party or cause."

Given the lack of transparency about the processes followed and the outcomes of decisions taken by the ANC's Cadre Deployment Committee, this application is additionally aimed at exercising and protecting the right of access to information contained in section 32 of the Constitution.

Finally, this application is also aimed at protecting the rights to human dignity, freedom, security of the person, administrative justice and socio-economic rights, including the rights to education, housing, and health care, which are infringed upon when serviced delivery declines due to unsuitable or unqualified persons being appointed to positions of authority due to the ANC's policy of cadre deployment.

2. Explain why the record requested is required for the exercise or protection of the aforementioned right(s);

The rights to equality and access to information

The testimony delivered in front of the Commission of Inquiry into Allegations of State Capture ("State Capture Commission") since 21 August 2018 has raised serious public concerns about the way in which the ANC's Cadre



Deployment Committee may have undermined the right to equality through favouring certain individuals for public appointment on the basis of their membership of the ANC and/or a particular faction within the ANC. The bearers of the right to equality whom have had their rights under 197 (3) of the Constitution infringed are those persons who are disfavoured in accessing government jobs as a result of the fact that cadre deployment reserves certain positions for ANC members.

The need for this application also arises precisely because there is very little information in the public sphere about the influence this Committee holds over appointments to the public sector, and the way In which it uses its control over the state to ensure that ANC members (or "cadres") are given preferential treatment during appointments to positions in the public sector. The lack of information that is publicly available about a body that has the power to influence appointments to public positions infringes on the right of access to information of all South Africans.

The information that is publicly available indicates that:

At its 1997 national conference, the ANC adopted a resolution "on the deployment and redeployment of our cadres." The governing party resolved to:

- "Put in place a deployment strategy which focuses on the short, medium and long term challenges, identifying the
 key centres of power, our strategy to transform these centres and the attributes and skills we require from our
 cadres to do so effectively;
- The establishment of deployment committees in the NEC, PEC, REC and BEC, which in implementing the above strategy should:
 - o discuss the deployment of comrades to areas of work on behalf of the movement, including the public service, parastatals, structures of the movement and the private sector;
 - such discussions of deployment of individual comrades be done with appropriate consultation with the cadre/s concerned;
 - o ensure capacity building to prepare comrades for deployment and redeployment in various spheres;
 - o do probity checks in all deployments and in general on appointments of staff;
 - o provide support and forums for accountability for cadres so deployed;
 - o refer disputes about the deployment or redeployment of cadres to the next highest structure for resolution;

Decisions of the organisation, after appropriate consultation with individual cadres, are final and a breach of this policy shall constitute a serious offence to be considered by the appropriate structure."

The testimony delivered in front of the State Capture Commission has made it clear that Cadre Deployment remains the official policy of the ANC. Numerous ANC members, including former President Jacob Zuma, have confirmed that Cadre Deployment continues to exist. From the testimony, it also became clear that Deputy President David Mabuza is the current chairperson of the Committee. In March 2019 – prior to the most recent national elections – Mabuza confirmed the ANC's intention to "accommodate" ANC members on election lists who did not make it into the relevant legislatures by appointing them to public sector positions. He said: "I'm sure the ANC will be able to look at other options to deploy its cadres so that we occupy every important point and every important institution in the country." This is but one news report out of many confirming the existence of the ANC's Cadre Deployment Committee.

During her testimony in front of the State Capture Commission, former Minister and ANC member Barbara Hogan testified that the ANC "saw it as their right to instruct a Minister who should be appointed and not appointed. That is an abuse of power and that is usurping executive authority."

As recently as June 2020, City Press reported on a leaked "Cadre Deployment Memo," which, among other things, instructed ANC members that "no appointment should be taken to cabinet without passing through the deployment committee first." Despite denials of its authenticity, City Press claimed that it verified the document with "three independent and highly placed sources in government and in Luthuli House."

Lastly, Hogan also explicitly highlighted the need for greater transparency on the Cadre Deployment Committee's decisions. She described it as: "a handful of people, if you see the number of appointments that go to Cabinet every time, I mean it is huge numbers of people, you do not know how many institutions Government has got, and for a handful of people just simply to decide that this is their preferred candidate, on what basis, what transparency is there?" 5

It is therefore clear that there are serious allegations in the public domain that the Cadre Deployment Committee violates the right to equality of applicants for public service positions during selection processes, because it is explicitly designed to favour a pre-determined group of ANC cadres. This amounts to a potential violation of section 197 (3) of the Constitution.

The rights to human dignity, freedom, security of the person, administrative justice, education, housing, and health care

In Glenister v President 2011 (3) SA 347 (CC) para 198, the Constitutional Court held that a failure on the part of the state "to create a sufficiently independent anti-corruption entity infringes a number of rights. These include the rights to equality, human dignity, freedom, security of the person, administrative justice and socio-economic rights, including the rights to education, housing, and health care."

Testimony delivered in front of the State Capture Commission, including the testimony delivered by former minister Hogan, confirms that the ANC's policy of cadre deployment has resulted in the appointment of persons to positions that they were not be suitable for. Service delivery subsequently declined as a direct result of the decisions taken under the ANC policy of cadre deployment. In the same way that the Constitutional Court found that the failure to create an independent anti-corruption entity undermined a host of Constitutional right, this application holds that the service delivery decline caused by the apparently unconstitutional influence of the ANC's cadre deployment committee over state appointments undermines the rights to human dignity, freedom, security of the person, administrative justice, education, housing, and health care.

Conclusion

Given the role of the ANC's cadre deployment policy in disfavouring applicants for government jobs who are not members of the ANC, the lack of information that is publicly available about how cadre deployment operates, and the role of cadre deployment in service delivery failures due to the appointment of unsuitable persons to public sector positions, there is thus a clear connection between the information requested and the protection of the (1) right to equality, (2) the right of access to information, and (3) the rights to human dignity, freedom, security of the person, administrative justice, education, housing, and health care.



AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF THE COMPLIANCE OF THE ORDER

I, the undersigned,

FIKILE APRIL MBALULA

do hereby make oath and say that:

- 1. I am an adult male and the Secretary General of the African National Congress ("the ANC").
- 2. The facts stated in this affidavit fall, unless the context indicates otherwise, within my personal knowledge and are both true and correct
- I depose to this affidavit on behalf of the Respondent, the ANC. I do so on the basis of the authority bestowed upon me by the ANC National Executive Committee. To that end, I attach a resolution to that effect as annexure "ANC 1".



4. To the extent that there are any submissions of law, these submissions are made on the advice of my lawyers which advice I believe to be true and correct.

PURPOSE OF THE AFFIDAVIT

- 5. This affidavit is an affidavit in compliance with the judgement handed down by the Honourable Judge Wepener on 2 February 2023 ("the Judgement").
- 6. The Judgement states the following:

"In my view, it may very well be so that Schreiber has a clear case to bring the application (and his right was not disputed save to the extent set out below), but that does not permit the DA to attempt to enforce provisions of PAIA without it having complied with the prerequisites contained in PAIA to enable it to launch an application of this nature. The DA failed to follow the prerequisite steps in order to rely on a right to approach a court for relief, and thus failed to lay a basis for its right to be an applicant in this matter as it never qualified as a 'requester' in terms of s 78(1) of PAIA."

- 7. Accordingly, the ANC, in compliance with the Order, hands the information requested to the First Applicant only, as the Second Applicant was found to not be entitled to the information.
- 8. Below, and in terms of the First Applicant's Form C request, is a description of the record or relevant part of the record which was requested by the First Applicant, and provided by the Respondent.
- 9. The following information has been attached;
 - a. The full contents of the ANC's Cadre Development Policy and Deployment Strategy for the period 1997 to 1 January 2021 (Annexure "ANC 2").





- b. Complete minutes for meetings of the National Deployment Committee ("the Committee") between 1 January 2018 to 1 January 2021 (Annexure "ANC 3").
- c. A list of all decisions taken by the Committee in relation to, and in correlation with, the minutes of the Committee meetings held between 1 January 2018 to 1 January 2021 (Annexure "ANC 4").
- d. It was the modus operandi of the Committee that, under certain circumstances, decisions were dealt with by Round-Robin (Annexure "ANC 5").
- e. Emails, WhatsApps, and other social media exchanges where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated upon, or taken during the period 1 January 2013 to 1 January 2021, and the contents thereof (Annexure "ANC 6"). These exchanges are only between Mr Thapelo Masilela and the members of the Committee and not the individual exchanges between the members themselves.
- f. Copies of CV's and vacancy notices which were considered for the period 1 January 2013 to 1 January 2021 (Annexure "ANC 7").
- g. All other correspondence communicating the decisions of the Committee for the period 1 January 2013 to 1 January 2021 which is in possession of the ANC at the time of signing this affidavit (Annexure "ANC 8").
- 10. The following information has not been attached:
 - a) Minutes for meetings of the Committee between the period December 2012 to December 2017. There are no minutes of meetings for this period as minutes were not kept. Minutes for these meetings were confirmed not to have been kept by Ms Desmoreen Carolus and Mr Lungi Mtshali, who were often present during those meetings during that period. Same is confirmed by Ms Desmoreen Carolus and Mr Lungi Mtshali in their confirmatory





affidavits attached, marked as annexure "ANC 9" and "ANC 10", respectively.

- b) Not all minutes were adopted and the minutes for 15 June 2020 could not be located.
- c) The non-existence of minutes for the period December 2012 to December 2017 was communicated to the Judicial Commission of Inquiry into Allegations of State Capture, Corruption and Fraud in the Public Sector ("Zondo Commission") by the then ANC legal adviser, Mr Krish Naidoo, and is attached hereto as annexure "ANC 11".
- d) The Zondo Commission's report further confirmed this and same can be seen in an extract of the report, attached as annexure "ANC 12".
- e) Decisions taken between December 2012 to December 2017 could not be retrieved as there are no minutes to confirm what decisions were deliberated upon, and supposedly taken by the Committee. It is possible that the Committee took decisions during that period, however, in the absence of minutes, any attempt at compiling a list of decisions would be an inaccurate reflection of the Committee's decisions during that period.
- f) Email addresses, telephone numbers, names and other biometric information that compromise the privacy and security of individual data subjects that appear in the annexures above have been redacted in compliance with the Protection of Personal Information Act No 4 of 2013 ("the POPI Act "). The POPI Act provides for:

Section 2 Purpose of Act

The purpose of this Act is to-

(a) give effect to the constitutional right to privacy, by safeguarding personal information when processed by a responsible party,

subject to justifiable limitations that are aimed at-

- (i) balancing the right to privacy against other rights, particularly the right of access to information; and
- (ii) protecting important interests, including the free flow of information within the Republic and across international borders;
- (b) regulate the manner in which personal information may be processed, by establishing conditions, in harmony with international standards, that prescribe the minimum threshold requirements for the lawful processing of personal information;
- (c) provide persons with rights and remedies to protect their personal information from processing that is not in accordance with this

Act; and

(d) establish voluntary and compulsory measures, including the establishment of an Information Regulator, to ensure respect for and to promote, enforce and fulfil the rights protected by this Act.

Section 9 Lawfulness of processing

Personal information must be processed-

- (a) lawfully; and
- (b) in a reasonable manner that does not infringe the privacy of the data subject.

Section 26 Prohibition on processing of special personal information

A responsible party may, subject to section 27, not process personal information concerning-

(a) the religious or philosophical beliefs, race or ethnic origin, trade union membership, political persuasion, health or sex life or biometric information of a data subject; or

- 11. The above quoted portions prevent the ANC from disclosing the personal information of the individual data subjects who appear in the records. Should the receiver of the information, as decided by the High Court, request the details which have been redacted to protect the personal information of individual data subjects, the information can be made available for physical inspection provided the respective individuals duly consent thereto.
- 12. The receiver of the information may inspect such information at our attorneys' offices with the explicit consent of the individual data subjects. We draw the receiver's attention to the provisions of POPIA against the misuse of information concerning individual data subjects, and the sanctions provided for such misuse.

STEPS TAKEN TO LOCATE THE DOCUMENTS.

- 13. We also outline the steps which were taken to locate the documents which the ANC could not provide, as per section C of the PAIA request.
- 14. The search began with the files of the late Deputy Secretary General, Ms Yasmin "Jessie" Duarte, who was the coordinator of the Deployment Committee for the period in question.
- 15. This also entailed consultations with the staff who provided secretarial services to the Committee during the period concerned.
- 16. With regard to the Minutes and *modus operandi* of the Committee the staff members indicated that these documents were not kept for the period in question.
- 17. It is worth mentioning that until 2018, the Deployment Committee did not keep minutes of its meetings. It was from the beginning of 2018, that minutes were kept. As indicated above, these minutes were submitted to the Zondo Commission.



- 18. In the absence of minutes of the Committee for the period in question, attempts were made to reconstruct the decisions taken by the Committee, based on other documents, including Organisational Report by the Secretary General to National General Councils (NGCs) and National Conferences for the period concerned. This proved to be of no avail as no decisions reported upon in these documents.
- 19. The policy and regulations governing the work of the Committee were communicated by the Secretary General's Office to ANC Ministers, as per decision and minutes of the Deployment Committee meeting of 14 October 2019.
- Searches of emails and other forms of communications also confirm the nonexistence of minutes for the period December 2012 to December 2017.
- 21. Mr. Thapelo Masilela (Strategic Support Manager: Deputy Secretary General's Office) confirmed that some information in respect to the Committee had unfortunately been lost when his laptop crashed. During 2023, his personal email account, which he used for the work of the Committee was full. In an attempt to free up space, he sorted emails by size and deleted the majority of the larger files. A number of emails which related to the Committee were included. Same is confirmed in his confirmatory affidavit, attached as annexure "ANC 13".
- 22. The information provided by the ANC is the information found to be in possession of the organization at the time of the signing of this affidavit, following a thorough search of our records.
- 23. All avenues available to the ANC have been exhausted in order to comply with the Court order. We submit that the ANC has taken all reasonable measures to comply with the order and the relevant legislation.



- Your letter dated 19 February 2024 and the ANC's purported compliance with the order of the High Court per Wepener J in Case 2021/26339, dated 2 February 2023 refers ("the Court order").
- We do not deal with each and every allegation in your letter or in the affidavit of Mr Fikile April Mbalula and the confirmatory affidavits thereto. We also do not address each and every way in which the ANC has failed to comply with the Court order. This does not amount to an admission, to acquiescence to the ANC's unlawful conduct, or to a waiver of our client's rights. Our client's rights remain fully reserved.


THE REQUIRED DISCLOSURES

The effect of the Constitutional Court order handed down on 12 February 2024 is that the High Court order has now become final and immediately enforceable.

- 5 The Court order directs the ANC "to provide all the information and records sought in Schreiber's request for access to information dated 22 February 2021 within 5 court days".
- Our client's request for information refers in turn to the following information which must be disclosed by the ANC under the Court order:
 - 6.1 Information on the processes followed and decisions taken by the ANC's Cadre Deployment Committee ("the Committee") between 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 6.2 The full contents of the ANC's cadre deployment policy including any amendments or changes introduced during the period of 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 6.3 Complete minutes including attendance registers for each meeting of the Committee during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 6.4 A list of all decisions taken by the Committee during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 6.5 The contents of any email, WhatsApp or other social media exchanges where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated or taken during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 6.6 Copies of all documents, including CVs and vacancy notices considered by the Committee during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021.
 - 6.7 All correspondence communicating the decisions of the Committee to government officials, members of Cabinet, members of selection panels, or any other appointing authorities in the state.

THE ANC HAS FAILED TO COMPLY WITH THE COURT ORDER

7 The ANC has failed to comply with the Court order in several respects.







The ANC is not permitted to redact documents

- The ANC has infringed the Court order by unilaterally redacting and thereby withholding select portions of the documents that have been disclosed. In particular, our client objects to the redaction of the names of Committee members, parties to communications, and the individuals discussed by the Committee.
- 9 The ANC purports to have made these redactions in order to comply with the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 ("POPIA").
- 10 The ANC's conduct in unilaterally effecting these redactions before disclosing the documents is unlawful and constitutes a breach of the Court order.
 - 10.1 POPIA does not require or authorise the ANC to conduct those redactions.
 - 10.2 Section 26 of POPIA read with section 27(1)(b) has the effect of generally prohibiting the processing of personal information but this prohibition does not apply if the processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of a right or obligation in law (section 27(1)(b)).
 - 10.3 This reflects the general authorisation in section 11(1)(c) of POPIA which allows personal information to be processed if it complies with an obligation imposed by law on the responsible party.
 - 10.4 In any event, even if POPIA did preclude certain disclosures (which it does not), the provisions of PAIA, and thus the Court order, take precedence. After all, section 5 of PAIA provides that it applies "to the exclusion of other legislation that... (a) prohibits or restricts the disclosure of a record of a public or private body; and (b) is materially inconsistent with an object, or a specific provision, of this Act".
- Disclosure of the complete unredacted records is required in order to comply with the order of Wepener J. As a result, any processing of personal information which is entailed by making that disclosure is permissible under POPIA because it constitutes compliance with a legal obligation which the ANC has.
- 12 As a result, Mr Mbalula's contention that POPIA required the ANC to carry out these redactions is unsustainable. The duty to disclose the full records in terms of a court


order constitutes an obligation imposed by law as contemplated in section 11 and 27 of POPIA and, accordingly, must be complied with and the processing is authorised in terms of those provisions.

- Moreover, the only time at which it may have been permissible for the ANC to raise concerns about the disclosure of personal information was when the ANC dealt with our client's PAIA requests.
 - 13.1 If there was any genuine confidentiality or privacy concerned arising out of the disclosure of the documents sought, the ANC was required to refuse the request for access on this basis in terms of section 63(1) of PAIA. The ANC did not do so.
 - 13.2 Moreover, the general duty on the ANC in section 63(1) of PAIA to refuse to disclose personal information is repeated in section 23(4)(a) of POPIA.
 - As a result, if the ANC wished to redact portions of the records it would have had to justify those redactions in the litigation in response to our client's PAIA request. It cannot now unilaterally redact the documents, having failed to raise this issue in the litigation. Its conduct in purporting to do so subverts and undermines the court order.

No information for a five-year period

- 14 The ANC has not complied with 6.1 and 6.3 above in that it has failed to disclose any minutes or attendance registers of the Committee's proceedings for the period 1 January 2013 May 2018.
- 15 The ANC's claim to be unable to find any documentation at all for the period December 2012 to May 2018 and for June 2020 is not credible.
 - 15.1 The ANC has at no stage following Mr Schreiber's PAIA request or during the litigation stated that the record or any portion thereof does not exist.
 - 15.1.1 To the contrary, Mr Krish Naidoo's communications with our client on his PAIA request expressed a willingness to disclose the requested information but for his objections, so inferring his knowledge of the record and that it existed.

- 15.1.2 The ANC vehemently opposed the Court order and would certainly have alleged that the information did not exist for a full five-year period of the request if this were true. It failed to raise this as a defence at any stage in the litigation.
- 15.1.3 If the ANC intended to rely on the alleged non-existence of the requested documents, it was obliged by section 55 of PAIA, after the request was received, to confirm on oath that the documents did not exist and the steps it had taken to locate the documents. It failed to do so.
- 15.2 The PAIA request is not limited to minutes of Committee meetings but extends to <u>all information</u> on the processes and decisions of the Committee during the period 2013 2021. Therefore, even if meeting minutes were not kept between 2013 2018 (which our client denies) this does not preclude the ANC from disclosing other sources of information on the Committee's processes and decisions during this time. It is not credible for the ANC to claim that there exists no documentary or digital trace at all of any communications on the Committee's processes during this five-year period.
- 15.3 The portion of the Zondo Commission report attached at "ANC12" in fact confirms that there exists information relating to the Committee's processes during the 2013 2018 period, even if not in the form of minutes. At paragraph 394, President Ramaphosa is reported as stating "I think those who are in charge will just take notes and just record a decision and it is then communicated". The ANC is required to disclose all of this information, including the "notes" taken, the decisions recorded, and the communication of those decisions as referred to by President Ramaphosa.
- 15.4 We stress, moreover, that the Commission held at paragraph 396 of "ANC12" that it was "improbable that there are no records of the Committee's activities between 2012 and 2017" and refers, amongst others, to the ANC's history of always ensuring important meetings are minuted. The ANC has not proven otherwise.
- 15.5 Mr Mbalula states at paragraph 10(a) of his affidavit that the fact that minutes were not kept is confirmed by Ms Desmoreen Carolus and Mr Lungi Mtshali who







he says "were often present during those meetings" during the period December 2012 to December 2017. However, the affidavits of Ms Carolus and Mr Mtshali do not confirm the allegation:

- 15.5.1 Ms Carolus states that she had nothing to do with the Committee at paragraph 5 of her affidavit and that "it never came across my desk in any form". There is therefore no basis for her to swear to whether or not records of the Committee's meetings and decisions were made. She also refers to an email as Annexure "DC1" but attaches no email to her affidavit.
- 15.5.2 Mr Mtshali does not state the period in which he acted as the coordinator in the office of the Deputy Secretary General or on what basis he would have knowledge of whether or not the Committee kept minutes or any other recording of its meetings. He discloses no efforts to locate his laptop or extract the documents thereon nor of any efforts to locate or extract documents or communications relating to the Committee which would likely have been stored on his email account. He refers to an email as Annexure "LM1" but attaches no such email to his affidavit.

Failure to list decisions taken

16 The ANC has not complied with 6.1 and 6.4 above in that it has failed to list any decisions taken by the Committee between 1 January 2013 – May 2018. Annexure "ANC4" does not in any event list the particular decisions taken by the Committee at all but refers only to "positions considered".

Impermissible restriction to 2020 communications of Mr Masilela

- 17 The ANC has not complied with 6.1, 6.5 and 6.7 above in that:
 - 17.1 As stated in paragraph 10(e) of Mr Mbalula's affidavit, the ANC has unilaterally decided to limit the scope of the information to those between Mr Masilela and the members of the Committee. The ANC was required to provide "any and all" such communications where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated or taken. This includes communications between Committee members.







- 17.2 The ANC has solely disclosed a select portion of largely illegible communications from 2020 and a few from 2019 and 2021. This precludes, amongst others, any and all emails, WhatsApps or other social media exchanges where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated or taken during 2013 2018.
- 17.3 The ANC has failed to disclose any of the attachments to the communications in "ANC6".

Illegible documents

- 18 The ANC has failed to comply with the Court order insofar as it has provided certain documents which are entirely illegible. The obviously poor quality of these documents exemplifies the obstructiveness of the ANC's approach to fulfilling the Court order.
- 19 Subsequent to the disclosure, we requested to be provided with legible copies of the WhatsApp communications. The document subsequently provided to us labelled "Legible ANC5 Whasapp correspondence" continues to include indecipherable information at pages 17 19 and 24 41.
- 20 Further to this, the following pages of the disclosures are illegible: page 10 of "ANC7 P1", pages 55 57 of "ANC7 P3", page 33 of "ANC7 P5", page 56 of "ANC7 P6", page 1 of "ANC7 P8", and page 29 of "ANC7 P11".

Minutes that were not adopted must be disclosed.

- 21 Mr Mbalula states at paragraph 10(b) of his affidavit that minutes of meetings that were not officially adopted have not been disclosed. This is impermissible and in breach of the Court order.
- 22 The Court order obliges the ANC to disclose all information on the processes and decisions of the Committee during the period 2013 2021. This would include documentary records of meetings in the form of notes and draft minutes, whether or not those minutes were ultimately adopted by the Committee.

Mr Mtshali's conduct is a criminal offence under PAIA

- 23 Mr Thapelo Masilela, an official of the ANC, states under oath in paragraph 6 of his affidavit, that he destroyed a number of the records that were the subject of the PAIA request after the Court order had been granted, and while the ANC's applications for leave to appeal were still pending.
- 24 This conduct constitutes an offence in terms of section 90(1) of PAIA which provides that:
 - "(1) A person who with intent to deny a right of access in terms of this Act—
 - (a) destroys, damages or alters a record;
 - (b) conceals a record; or
 - (c) falsifies a record or makes a false record,

commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two years."

- 25 Mr Masilela's conduct was plainly conducted with the intent of denying our client's right of access in terms of PAIA and accordingly constitutes a criminal offence. This too demonstrates the extent to which the ANC intends to subvert the Court order.
- An appropriate criminal charge will be laid against Mr Masilela and these facts will be placed before the court which hears any contempt application should it be necessary to approach the court for such relief.

The steps to locate the information are inadequate

- 27 The steps allegedly taken by the ANC to locate the requested information are inadequate and do not amount to reasonable compliance with the Court order.
- 28 Mr Mbalula states only that the files of the late Ms Duarte were searched and that staff members who provided secretarial services to the Committee were consulted. Mr Mbalula does not state:
 - 28.1 which staff members were consulted; or





- 28.2 that any or all of the still living members of the Committee during 2013 2021 were consulted or their files examined.
- 29 Had the ANC genuinely endeavoured to make a full disclosure as the Court order requires it to do, it would have timeously contacted and obtained information from each and every member of the Committee during the period 2013 to 2021.


THE ANC IS IN CONTEMPT OF THE COURT ORDER

- 30 The ANC's conduct subverts the Court order and amounts to contempt of court.
 - 30.1 The ANC is clearly aware of the Court order and has disobeyed it as set out above.
 - 30.2 The ANC's disobedience is wilful and mala fide.

DEMAND

- 31 We are instructed to demand that, within two days of this letter, the ANC discloses:
 - 31.1 all information relating to the processes and decisions of the Cadre Deployment Committee during the period <u>January 2013 to May 2018</u>, including but not limited to minutes of meetings, notes, WhatsApps, emails and all other communications;
 - 31.2 a list of <u>all decisions taken</u> by the Committee during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021;
 - 31.3 all emails, WhatsApps or other social media exchanges where decisions of the Committee were discussed, deliberated or taken during 1 January 2013 and 1 January 2021, not limited to those between Mr Masilela and the Committee Members and including all communications between and amongst Committee Members of this nature;
 - 31,4 all of the attachments to the communications in "ANC6";
 - 31.5 legible copies of the information at pages 17 19 and 24 41 of the document titled "Legible ANC5 Whatsapp correspondence" and at page 10 of "ANC7


P1", pages 55 – 57 of "ANC7 P3", page 33 of "ANC7 P5", page 56 of "ANC7 P6", page 1 of "ANC7 P8", and page 29 of "ANC7 P11";

- 31.6 all draft minutes, notes and attendance registers of Committee meetings during the period 1 January 2013 and January 2021 which were excluded from the disclosure on the basis that the minutes were not adopted;
- 31.7 the unredacted versions of all documents so as to indicate the names of all persons appearing therein or referred to. For the avoidance of doubt, our client requires only the names of the individuals referred to in the Cadre Deployment records to be disclosed and do not require other personal information to the extent that it is there, such as cell phone numbers and addresses.
- We are further instructed to demand that the ANC make available the following within two days of this letter for inspection by an independent third-party IT expert agreed to by our clients for purposes of extracting information required to be disclosed by the Court order:
 - 32.1 the hard drive and / or laptop referred to by Mr Masilela at paragraph 5 of his affidavit;
 - 32.2 the personal email of Mr Masilela referred to at paragraph 6 of his affidavit; and
 - 32.3 the laptop referred to by Mr Mtshali at paragraph 7 of his affidavit.
- 33 Should the ANC fail to abide by our client's demands, our client has instructed us to approach the court on an urgent basis for appropriate relief.



1. PURPOSE

1.1 To request the Deployment Committee to support the nomination of Ms and Ms

The appointed as Members of theBoard of the Independent Regulatory Board for Auditors (IRBA) for a period of two (2) years, commencing from the date of approval by Cabinet subject to verification of qualifications and security clearance to be conducted by the Board of IRBA.

2. SUMMARY

- 2.1 The previous Board of IRBA comprised of six members and was appointed on 10 May 2017 and their term was subsequently extended by the Minister of Finance to 9 May 2020. As from 10 May 2020 the IRBA has been without a Board and the Chief Executive Officer has assumed the role of Accounting Authority in accordance with section 49 of the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (PFMA).
- 2.2 The Board has three sub-committees, the Audit and Risk Management Committee, Disciplinary Advisory Committee and the Operations Committee, and the Board members will also be nominated to a sub-committee.
- 2.3 The Minister of Finance is of the View that the ten (10) new members proposed will be suitable to ensure that IRBA achieve its strategic objectives and fulfil its mandate in a period where the auditing profession as a whole needs restoration.

3. DISCUSSION

Overview of the IRBA

3.1 IRBA is the regulator of the auditing profession and adheres to the highest ethics and standards, the mission is to protect the financial interests of the

South African public and international investors through effective regulation of assurance in accordance with internationally recognised standards and processes.

- 3.2 The IRBA was established in terms of the Auditing Profession Act, Act 26 of 2005. Section 11 of the Auditing Profession Act provides that the Regulatory Board consists of not less than six but not more than 10 non-executive members appointed by the Minister. (Annexure A).
- 3.3 The previous IRBA Board comprised of (6) six members whose term has come to an end on 9 May 2020. The Minister is recommending the appointment of a total of 10 non-executive members to the Board.

RESPONSE TO PURPORTED APPLICATION BY DEMOCRATIC ALLIANCE IN TERMS OF THE PROMOTION OF ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT, 2000

On Thursday last week we received a communique from Rapport journalist, Mr Dawie Boonzaaier, requesting a response from the ANC to the Democratic Alliance's request for information in terms of the Promotion of Access to Information Act.

According to the journalist, it appears that the Democratic Alliance (DA) has made application to access the records of every meeting of the ANC's Deployment Committee since 1 January 2013 and requires a list of all decisions taken and reasons for those decisions.

Apparently the request was made by DA MP, Mr Leon Schreiber, on 11th inst. We have no record of having received such a request. Kindly forward a copy to my email address krishn@mweb.co.za. This letter is written on the assumption that such a request for information was made by the DA. If the DA did not make such a request, kindly ignore this letter and accept the ANC's apology.

It is common cause that the African National Congress was the forerunner in spearheading the constitutional democracy and rights we enjoy under our Constitution which did not come cheaply. ANC members were hanged, exiled, imprisoned, maimed and bludgeoned to death to give us the freedoms we all enjoy today. For this reason, the organisation will not only uphold the rights in our Constitution but also defend those rights.

We are aware that section 32(2) of the Constitution paved the way for the enactment of the Promotion of Access to Information Act (PAIA) to enable any third party to access information of public and private bodies. As you are aware, the promulgation of PAIA marked a clean break from the secretive and undemocratic past of South

Africa under apartheid rule.

Once again, the ANC was a cheer leader in the promulgation of PAIA in order to foster a culture of transparency and accountability in our country. Consequently, the ANC will be the first to accede to the request for information under PAIA from the DA or any other party.

Section 50 of the Act provides that the DA must be given access if the information is required for the exercise or protection of any rights. Accordingly, our law, as interpreted by our Courts, requires the DA to fulfil two distinct requirements before such information could be made available to it.

First, the DA must identify the right that it seeks to exercise or protect and show that *prima facie* it has established that it has such a right; and second, the DA must demonstrate how the information will assist in exercising or protecting the right.

In short, the DA must establish a connection between the information requested (in this case minutes and information of the ANC Deployment Committee) and the right sought to be exercised or protected and must lay a proper foundation for why that information is reasonably required for the exercise or protection of the right.

The required information will be made available once the DA has satisfied the legal requirements for its request as set out above. As an aside, when the National Chairperson, comrade Gwede Mantashe, made a presentation to the State Capture Commission in November 2018, he tabled the offer to make available the ANC's Deployment Policy.
