Essential services units have been rendered quite dysfunctional, as they have exhausted their budgets, in certain departments. Electricity, water and sanitation has seen the largest dip in service delivery, particularly over the festive period. There are insufficient plumbers, contractors and spares to deal with faults and repairs, resulting in a tremendous prejudice to ratepayers. The situation has reached a critical state and needs urgent intervention.

- 1. Investigate the feasibility of Reprioritization of budget in January 2025,
- 2. That savings be identified to allocate to the EWS and electricity clusters urgently

MOTIVATION FOR MOTION IN TERMS OF SECTION 22 OF THE RULES OF ORDER

The DA notes with grave concern the significant dysfunction within essential service units, particularly over the festive period, as we have only now learned that they have exhausted their budgets. The departments of electricity, water, and sanitation have experienced the most severe decline in service delivery. The situation has become critical, and immediate intervention is necessary.

The lack of sufficient plumbers, contractors, and spare parts has led to numerous unresolved faults and repairs, causing considerable prejudice to ratepayers.
