8.	whether the municipality can kindly provide a strategy for dealing with illegal electrical connections within identified hotspot areas;	The short-term strategy is the continuous removal of these illegally connected wires and the enforcement of the bylaws.
		The long-term solution is the increasing of the equitable share value from 50 to 350 kWh's per month and the electrification of these informal areas, with these potential customers receiving 350 kWh's free from the equitable share allocation.
		NB – The short-term approach is being restricted due to lack of operational budget and resources.
