# NOTICE OF MOTION IN TERMS OF RULE 131 OF THE STANDING RULES OF THE EASTERN CAPE PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE

I hereby move in terms of Rule 131 (1) of the Standing Rules that this House:

#### **NOTING**

- That in the past three months, several people have been kidnapped in Nelson Mandela Bay, including but not limited to:
  - A 38-year-old New Brighton shop owner was kidnapped on 11 June.
  - o Lindsay Knowlden was abducted from the Fresh Produce Market on 21 June.
  - o Ebenese "Ebbie" Williams, kidnapped in Cleary Estate on 3 July.
  - o Chris Kaldelis, abducted in Schauderville on 8 July.
  - o Theresa Minnie (73) was kidnapped in Kariega on 11 August.
  - o A Holland Park man was kidnapped on 13 August.

#### Further noting

- Nelson Mandela Bay has recorded multiple high-profile abductions in a short period.
- These crimes are not isolated incidents but part of a sustained wave of violent targeting
  of residents and business owners. They are a direct threat to livelihoods, jobs, and
  investment in Nelson Mandela Bay, a Metro already crippled by unemployment.
- The MEC for Community Safety, Xolile Nqatha, has claimed that a Hawks standby team and other multidisciplinary interventions are sufficient. The continuing wave of kidnappings proves this claim false and demonstrates that current interventions are failing.

### THEREFORE RESOLVES

1. That the MEC for Community Safety must, without delay, engage the Provincial Commissioner and formally request the Minister of Police to establish a permanent 24-hour Joint Operations Centre in Nelson Mandela Bay, led by the Hawks, SAPS, Metro Police, and the NPA.

- That this Joint Operations Centre must use existing resources across these agencies
  to avoid duplication and ensure accountability, while coordinating real-time
  intelligence sharing, conducting targeted operations in hotspots, and fast-tracking
  prosecutions with clear public reporting on arrests, dockets enrolled, and convictions
  secured.
- 3. That the plan must include a confidential reporting line for residents and businesses, protection for witnesses, and direct liaison with sector bodies so that information flows quickly and safely.
